

NATIONAL 10 BALL CHAMPIONSHIP 23/24

RULES & REGULATIONS

ENTRIES

- 1. The tournament is open only to Citizens and Permanent Resident of Singapore.
- 2. Participants must submit their entries on official entry forms not later than
 - 19th March Tuesday @ 23:59 hour for National 10 Ball Championship 23/24
- 3. Participants <u>must pay</u> a non-refundable entry fee upon submission of entry forms. If the entry fees are not received by the draw date, the entry form <u>will not be accepted</u>. The participant is deemed to have opted out of the tournament and his/her name <u>will not be drawn</u> in the tournament.
- 4. For Clubs, undertaking letter must be sent to Cuesports Office before the Closing Date.
- **5.** Entry fees for tournaments will be as follows:

- **6.** Entries are accepted subject to the condition that the participant shall, if nominated by Cuesports Singapore, represent the Republic of Singapore in any event held within 12 months upon the completion of the tournament.
- 7. Cuesports Singapore may at its sole discretion waive compliance with the condition laid out in paragraph 6 if furnished with valid reasons in writing by the participant(s).
- **8.** SPR are not eligible for training in the National squads or events held for squad players, or for selection to represent Singapore, regardless of their tournament results.

GAME RULES

9. The tournament will be played under the latest Standardised Rules of the World Pool-Billiard Association (WPA).

- **a.** The balls will be racked with the 1 ball placed on the foot spot, 2 and 3 ball placed on the corners.
- **b.** Players are allowed to check the rack **twice** and allow to make **one** request for re-rack or make adjustment to the rack when 1-1 referee is deployed.
- c. Re-breaking is not an option.
- **d.** No pattern racking.
- **e.** Obvious shot **need not** be called. Non-obvious shot is required to be called (the intended ball and pocket must be indicated for each called shot). For a called shot to count, the referee must be satisfied that the intended shot was made.
- **f.** The 10 ball must be the last ball to be pocketed to win the rack.
- **g.** After the breaking of rack, should 2 or more balls remain on top of the magic rack, preventing it to be removed, at the discretion of the referee, the game may continue without having the magic rack removed.

TOURNAMENT VENUE

10. The tournament will be played at Aspire Recreation Centre located at 1 Maritime Square, #04-02, Singapore 099253.

SCHEDULE

11. The schedule for the tournament is as follows:

12. Starting from 31st March 2024 participants may refer to the notice board at the tournament venue for the fixtures of the tournament. Participants may also view the fixtures on the Cuesports Singapore's Facebook page (www.facebook.com/CuesportsSingapore).

FORMAT

13. The tournament will be played on a <u>straight knock-out format, alternate break</u> as follows:

- **14.** Should there be less than 80 entries for the Open category and 20 entries for the Ladies category by the closing date. Cuesports Singapore reserves the right to cancel the tournament for the category and/or to change the prize money accordingly.
 - Open category 128 slot maximum
 - Women category 32 slot maximum

TOURNAMENT SEEDING

- **15.** The seeding for the tournament shall be based on the National Pool ranking list on the Cuesports website. The top 16 ranked players for Men's and top 8 for ladies shall be seeded for the tournament.
- **16.** If one or more ranked players do not participate in the tournament, the Tournament Committee shall at its discretion select players based on the merits of their tournaments in previous local and overseas tournaments and seed them accordingly.
- **17.** Seeded players will play in the tournament from the last-32 stage onwards, where they will join the 16 unseeded players who have progressed to that stage of the tournament. (For Open's event only). Top 8 ladies will be seeded for the tournament.

18. DRESS CODE

Men Dress Code

Polo T-shirt and short or long sleeve collared shirt, formal dress pants or dark coloured chino pants. Single coloured socks and covered leather shoes / formal dress shoes.

No track pants, cargo pants, jeans and no sports shoes.

Ladies Dress Code

Polo T-shirt, presentable blouse, dress pants, dress shoes.

No round neck t-shirt, no jeans, no dress, skirts, shorts, track pants, tights, no sandals or open-toes shoes.

Semi Finals onwards (Man & Ladies Dress Code)

Long sleeve, plain coloured and buttoned at the cuff. Dress pants. Single coloured socks and Dress shoes. Bow tie and vest shall be worn from Semi Finals onwards.

- **19.** Players will have to put on any sponsor badges/stickers while playing in the tournament when told to do so by the organisers. Please note that any competitive sponsors' brands or insignias are **Not Allowed** to be worn at any stage throughout the tournament.
- **20.** 1st offence Players who are not properly attired during the match will be issued a warning (penalty can apply for shirt, pants or shoes violation).

2nd offence - Players who are not properly attired will be issued a dress code penalty of 1 frame (penalty can apply for shirt, pants or shoes violation).

Exception – Players who commit their 1st offence playing another match on the same day will be counted under the same offence.

MATCH PROCEDURES

- **21.** No delays or postponement of matches will be allowed unless deemed necessary by the Tournament Committee. Should there be a clash of match time with ladies & open event, the organizer has the right to change the time due to such circumstances.
- **22.** All players must report to the Tournament Chief Referee upon arrival with his/her identity card and take note of the match table.
- 23. If a player is not present by the commencement of his/her match he/she will concede one (1) rack to his opponent. If the player is not present by the 5th minute, he/she will concede a total of two (2) racks to his opponent. If the player is still not present by the 10th minute, the match will officially be recorded as a walkover and the match will be awarded to the opponent. The clock at the tournament venue shall serve as the official tournament clock.

- **24.** Participants who fail to turn up for their matches must email to Cuesports Sg the reason for his/her absent within 3 days of their match. Players who fail to do so or players who are deemed by Cuesports Sg to have an invalid excuse for their absent will be barred from taking part in any future tournaments organized by Cuesports Singapore for a stipulated period.
- 25. Each player will only be allowed to call one (1) time-out which must be in between racks and lasting not more than seven (7) minutes. Should the player exceed the time allowed, a rack will be conceded to his/her opponent. However, players may request for toilet breaks which may be allowed at the sole discretion of the referee. The toilet break must not be used for other purposes such as smoking or communicating with any person. Any players found doing so may be disqualified.

MATCH SAFETY MEASURES

- **26.** Participants not feeling well are advised to refrain from coming to the tournament or entering the venue.
- 27. Participants are encouraged to always practice personal hygiene.

TOURNAMENT REPORTING PROCEDURE

28. All players must adhere to the following procedures:

30 mins before All players to report to the Chief Referee for verification

15 mins before Warm-up of 5 minutes per player

5 mins before Conduct of lag to determine break

Scheduled time Commencement of match

For 2nd to 5th session matches. Warm up is subjected to the time allowance after the end of the previous match and also reporting time of player.

29. Matches will be scheduled on the following days as follows:

Monday to Wednesday evenings – 2 sessions a day starting from 7pm

Saturday & Sunday – Up to 4 sessions a day starting from 10.30am

30. Players are advised to report 30 mins before your match time. If there are tables available and both competitors have reported to the Chief Referee, the match may commence before the scheduled time.

SLOW PLAY and 45 SECONDS RULE

31. If the overseeing referee deems there is deliberate slow play, they will warn the player of the slow play decision twice. Should the player continue his/ her slow play, 1 rack will be awarded to the opponent. Subsequently should the player not heed the warnings and continue slow play, the match will be awarded to the opponent.

- **32.** The overseeing referee at his/her discretion may use the 45 seconds rule if he/she deems the match is proceeding too slowly.
- **33.** In the presence of 1-1 referee, shot clock shall be used. Each player will be allowed 45sec to execute his / her shot. After all the balls have come to a stop, the referee shall start the shot clock. When the shot clock reaches 35 sec, the referee will call "10 seconds" and the player has another 10 sec to execute his/ her shot. Failing to do so will result in a foul. Each player is allowed one extension of 45 seconds per rack.

Other Conditions

- **34.** Players are not allowed to smoke in the tournament venue or in the surrounding vicinity and are not allowed to place any cigarettes or lighters in the player's seating area.
- **35.** Players are not allowed to use their hand phones in the tournament venue and are also required to switch their mobile phones or pagers to silent mode.
- **36.** Players must be at their best behavior whilst in the tournament venue and must not say or do anything that may discredit the tournament, the sponsors, Cuesports Singapore and/or bring the sport into disrepute.

PRIZES

37. The estimated prize money distributions are as follows. The exact confirmed prize money will be announced on a later date.

38. Due to Covid-19 only Semi Finalist and above are required to be present at the prize presentation ceremony, failing which their prize money might be forfeited, unless a valid reason is given 24 hours in advance. In addition, he/she shall send a representative to receive the prize on his/her behalf.

AUTHORITY

- **39.** All enquires or disputes will be referred to the Chief Referee during the tournament running and his decision will be final.
- **40.** All disciplinary matters shall be referred to the Cuesports Singapore Disciplinary Sub-Committee, whose decision shall be final on all matters arising.
- **41.** The Tournament Committee reserves the right to amend and/or add rules to the above set of rules and regulations with prior notification to the participants as and when it deems necessary. Any matter not covered by the above set of rules and regulations shall be decided upon by the Tournament Committee whose decision shall be final in such matters.
